Joseph Burghart served as a Private in D Company of the 17<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment of Missouri. In December 1862 he was wounded at Vicksburg, Mississippi, and was in the Fleet Hospital in Saint Louis, Missouri. On 30 September 1863 he was transferred the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, Veterans Reserve Corps of the U.S. Army.
