Franklin was the eldest of four sons born to Andrew Van Hyning and Polly Robinson. Born in Summit County, Ohio, he was living in Calhoun County, Michigan by 1861 when he married Lucy Ann Alvord. Their first child, Orpha Jane was born in 1862. Franklin enlisted in Company E, 13th Michigan Infantry Regiment on 29 February 1864 at Jackson, Michigan. He mustered out at Louisville, Kentucky on 25 July 1865. In 1871, his son Andrew Ensign was born. Andrew suffered from a spinal disease and passed away at the age of 16. Orpha Jane, or Jennie as she was called, passed away five years later, in 1893. Franklin and Lucy remained in Michigan until at least 1900, and eventually moved to Orange County, California by 1910. Lucy is buried with her children in Michigan.

His brother Darius Van Hyning (1839-1865) enlisted in Company C, 20<sup>th</sup> Regiment Michigan Infantry 15 March 1865; joined regiment near Petersburg, Virginia 1 April 1865; transferred to Company G, 2<sup>nd</sup> Regiment Michigan Infantry 30 May 1865; mustered out at DeLaney House, DC 28 July 1865.

His brother Lewis Van Hyning (1841-1914) enlisted in Company E, 13<sup>th</sup> Regiment Michigan Infantry 5 January 1864 at LeRoy, Michigan; was wounded in action at Bentonville, North Carolina 19 March 1865; admitted to Harper Hospital 6 April 1865; discharged at Detroit, Michigan 21 June 1865.

His brother Mortimer Van Hyning (1844-1923) enlisted in Company G, 29<sup>th</sup> Regiment Ohio Infantry; discharged 22 October 1861.
